Tephra Institute of Contemporary Art: Social Guide




Introduction


1. Getting to the Gallery

Tephra Institute of Contemporary Art is located in Reston Town Center. RTC has many garages that are free to park in on the weekends or after 5pm. There is also street parking available. We can pay by pay station location in the garages or the ParkRTC app.



2. Entering the Gallery

- The building is white and brown and has many glass windows. We are going there to look at contemporary art. Contemporary art is art that is made by artists who are alive and working today!
- There are 3 steps down to enter the museum. I can also use the ramp to the left of the steps if that is more convenient for me.




3. Once You're Inside

- Tephra ICA is free to the public! We don't need tickets to enter. We will stop at the big desk at the front to sign in with our name, email, and zip code. This helps Tephra ICA keep the gallery free and fun for everyone!
- When we sign in, the person at the front might give us special instructions about the art. For example, the art might be fragile. We always want to listen to these instructions so we can keep the art safe!



4. Coat Check and What to Bring

- If we have coats or purses we don't want to carry, we can hang them on the coat rack inside! The person at the front desk will be happy to show us where it is.
- If it helps me, I can bring fidget toys or noise cancelling headphones.



5. Gallery Guides


- I can always ask the person at the front desk if I have a question about the art! They can also direct me to the restroom.
- If I need to take a break, or I'd like to make some crafts of my own, I can go to the Explore More area and see what activities are available for the current exhibition.



6. In the Gallery


I will remember these rules so I can make sure everyone has fun and the art is protected!
